

Outpost Special Pricing Policies

Unless one of the following situations arises, the regular rental pricing sheet should be used.

1. 2 week plus..... rentals
 - a. Get 20% off of these two weeks and every rental period thereafter. (e.g. 4 weeks is still 20% off the total amount of this rental)
2. Season Passes
 - a. Are available for one item or package equivalent to 3 weeks individual rental. (E.g. three weeks of a canoe package is \$194.)
 - b. This rental is good for 1 year from date of payment.
 - c. Rentals are allowed for only the dates specified by the person who is renting, or by the Outpost staff who specifies that the item must be back by a certain date due to another reservation. **Class** and **prior reservations** take priority over season pass renters, and renters must realize that they may be asked to return equipment.
 - d. Items brought back late are charged the normal rate until the item is returned.
 - e. Season passes must be paid in full and include a credit card number.
 - f. **Rentals are limited to 1 week at a time** and then may be rented for the following week, etc.
3. Staff rentals
 - a. Staff rentals are free of charge (–see staff rental form for details-)
 - b. All items rented by staff **MUST** be checked out through the staff rental system at the Outpost. Any failures to do so will result in lose of this privilege for the **year**.
 - c. Staff may rent any items that are not on RESERVE or otherwise needed for classes.
 - d. Staff may not **reserve** equipment unless they pay the normal fee.
 - e. All staff free rental privileges end after graduation in May, and begin after Outdoor Orientation returns in September, unless the staff is currently working, (i.e. summer Outpost manager) or is committed to working in the same position next semester.
4. Outpost “friends”
 - a. Staff may rent equipment out to friends by filling out the friends’ rental sheet. (see coordinator) The amount of the rental must be paid back through work-trade at the program. In other words, if your friend rented a canoe for a month (\$320) then you must work the hours in order to pay for this rental. Friends’ wages are \$6 an hour, so at this rate the rental would cost would be around 53 hours you would have to put in “off the books.” This work **must be done prior** to the rental.
5. Half day rentals
 - a. Are for a maximum of 4 hours.
